2017 Dress Code and Turnout Guidelines

This is not compulsory, except where indicated, and is intended as a guide of what our judges are looking for from competitors.

Showing Rings 3 and 4 – competitor dress code

In-Hand Classes (Ring 4)	Ridden Classes (Ring 3)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tweed jacket, Waistcoat or smart sweatshirt • Shirt and tie • Jodhpurs or trousers • Hard hat required for Juniors and optional/ advisable for Seniors • Optional short cane or whip to be carried 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tweed or Plain jacket • Beige jodhpurs • Riding boots/short boots and jodh clips if under 17 • Hard hat • Short cane or whip • No spurs to be worn by juniors

In the 'Ridden' classes it is normal to remove horse boots and body protectors for the showing phase.

Mountain and Moorland (Ridden and In-Hand)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Natural state – no plaiting (except for a single plait) • Trimmed as allowed by individual breed society
Hunter - Ridden	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Preferably plaited or hogged
Coloured and Native Coloured In-Hand	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Non-native coloured ponies are usually shown plaited. • Native coloured ponies can be shown in natural state or hogged and feathers removed.
Arab - Ridden	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Natural state but may have an Arab plait
Others	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Natural state

- Concours D'Elegance

- .Period attire required the only exception being BHS riding hat and appropriate foot wear
- .Astirde or side saddle
- .On or Off Lead Rein
- .Rider to ride an individual show
- .To be assessed 50% on attire and 50% from the show / way of going.

This is not intended as a fancy dress or 'bling' class.

Show jumping Rings 1 and 2

All riders to wear:

- Jacket (long sleeved)
- Shirt and tie or stock
- Approved hard hat
- Body protector recommended
- Optional short whip not exceeding 18 inches

If the weather is hot the judge may allow removal of jackets.

Dressage – Ring 5

We have no additional requirements to the above. There is a preference that the horse/pony should be ridden in a snaffle bit.
